U.A.E. POSTAL HISTORY 1972-2000

This exhibit shows the development of postal services in the United Arab Emirates under Federal Ministry of Communication and General Postal Authority with special study and research on different type of date-stamps (postmarks) along with route and postal rates used during the period.

The United Arab Emirates (U.A.E.) was established on 2 December 1971 by six emirates. Abu Dhabi, Dubai, Sharjah, Ajman, Fujairah and Umm Al - Quwain. The Emirate of Ras Al-Khaimah joined on 11 February 1972. The capital is Abu Dhabi. Each emirate continued to use its own postal system and postage until a Postal Administration was established on 1 August 1972.

Following unification postal services were under the Federal Ministry of Communication till General Postal Authority formed in 1985.
