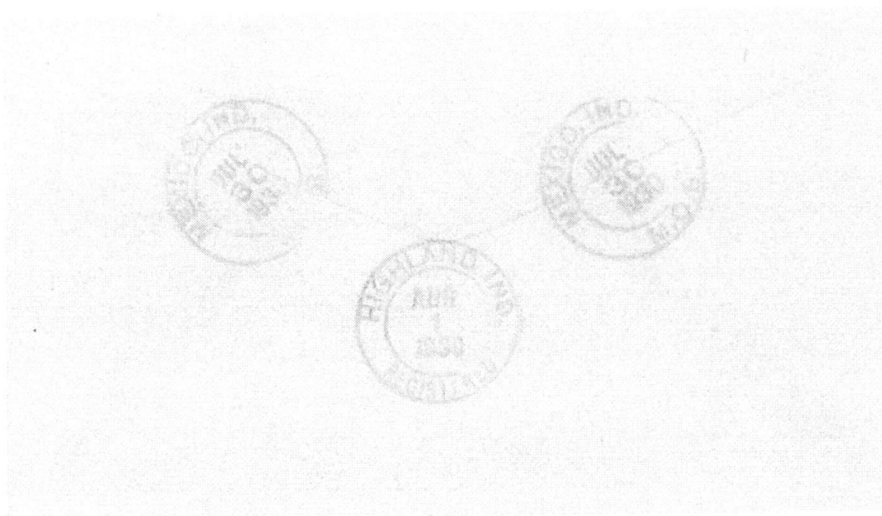
In 1927 a reminder of the laws and postal regulations of 1924 stipulating that the postage stamps of the recommended consignments should not in any case be cancelled with the stamp date containing the places and dates of registrations is the origin of our 'births'.

The "postmasters" having no material to obliterate these mails, aided by "volunteers" (Barnes, Payne, Mechin, etc.) had all leisure to appeal to their imagination..

Our representations were often related to the location of the post office and, more or less decorative according to the artistic talents of the creator.

Locally "sculptable" materials such as wood, rubber, gum and even potato, etc. have been used to represent us.

All the recommended envelopes must have on the reverse side 2 stamps at the date of the departure city as well as that of arrival as in the copy below. In the case where the destination was the same as the place of departure, only two stamps were on the back of the original date.

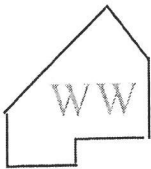
